Type Selector

```
p {  
  font-size: 12px;  
}
```

```
<p>This is a short  
paragraph</p>
```

Class Selector

indicates that it's a Class Selector

class name (or style name)

```
.smalltype {  
  font-size: 10px; }
```

```
<p class="smalltype">  
This is some small  
text</p>
```

ID Selector

indicates that it's an ID Selector

ID name (or style name)

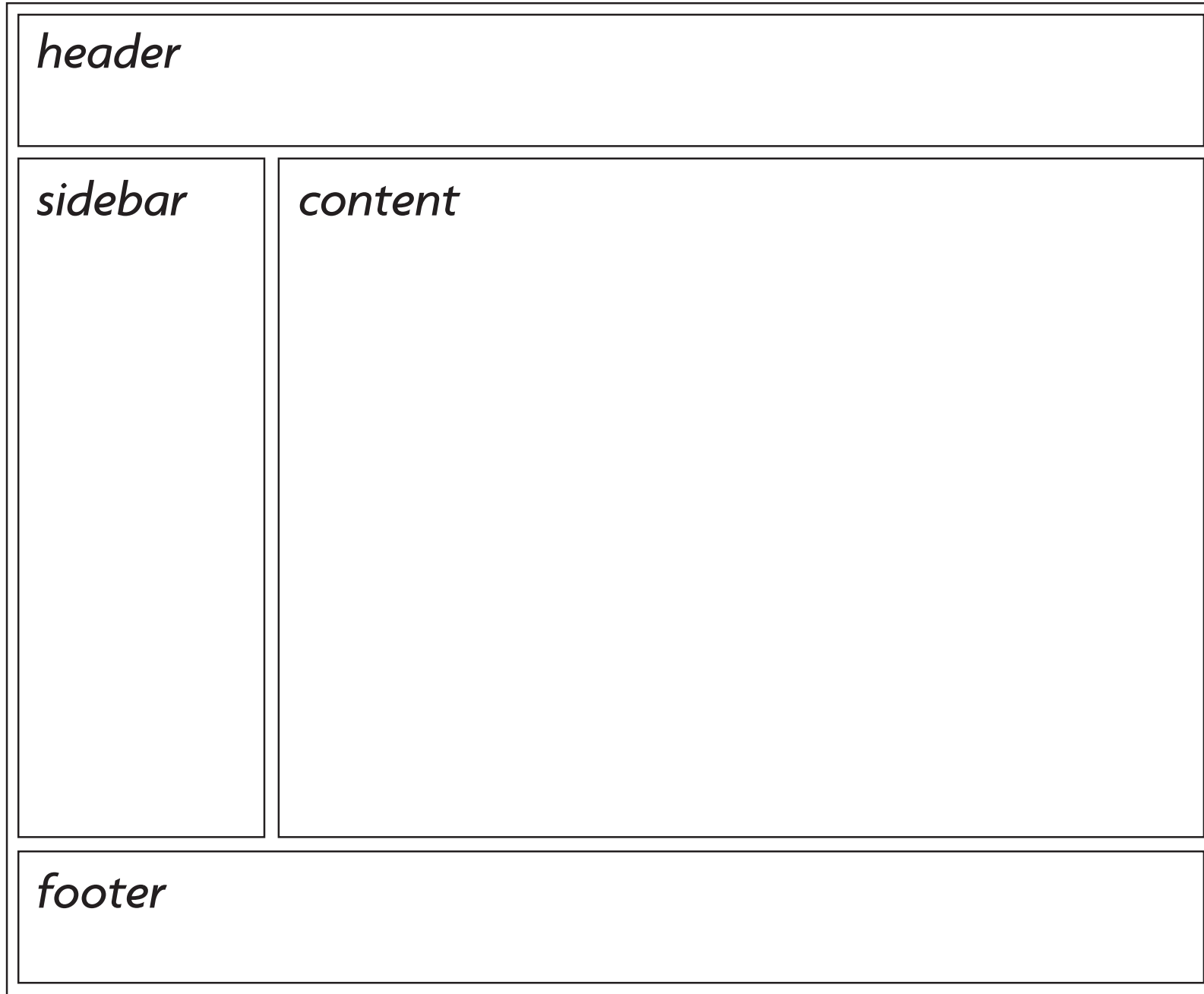
```

  font-size: 36px;  
  text-align: center;

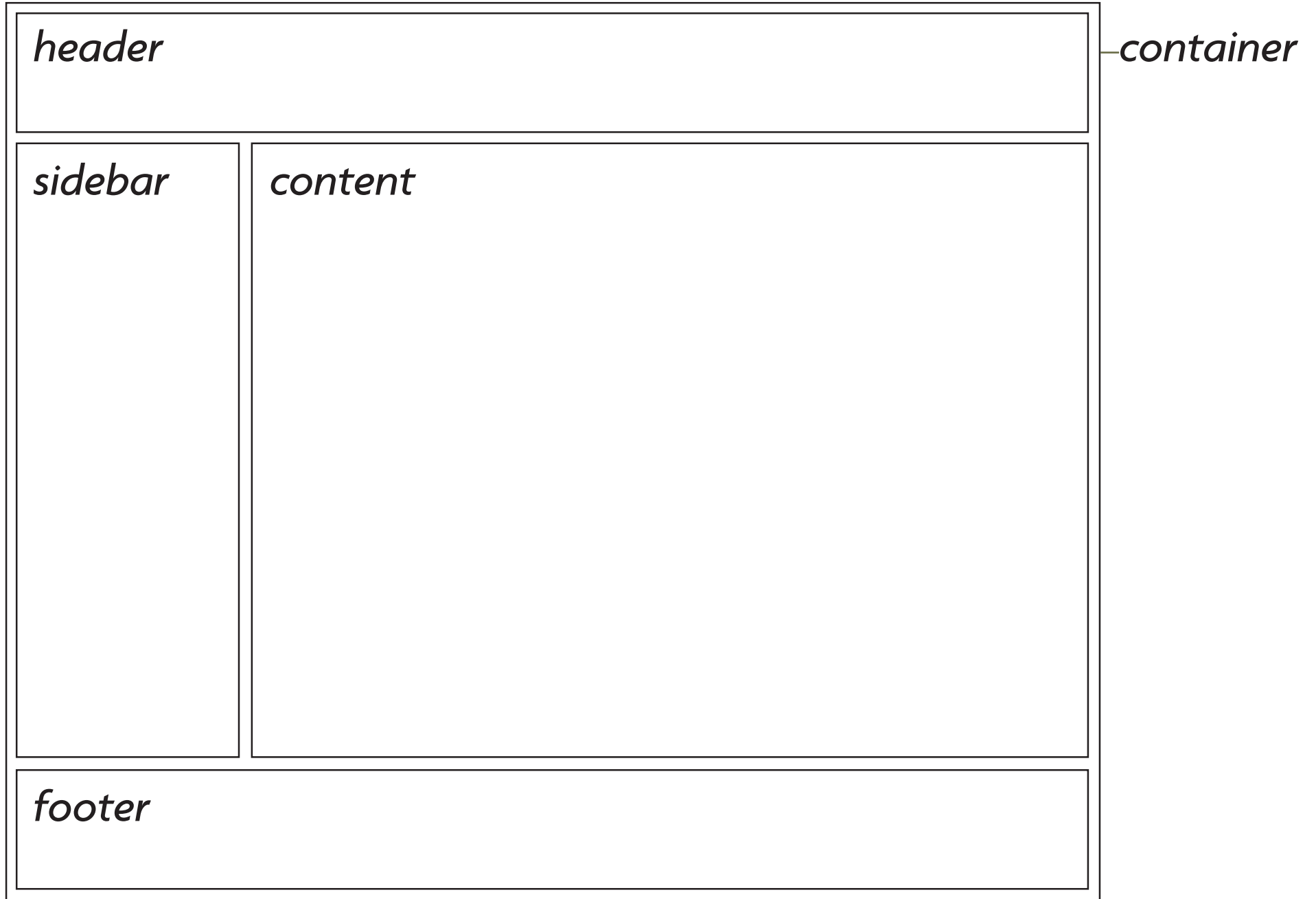

In the previous example we use 5 different named DIVs. How do we decide whether to use an ID or a Class?

IDs

IDs are unique. Each page can have only one element with an ID.

Classes

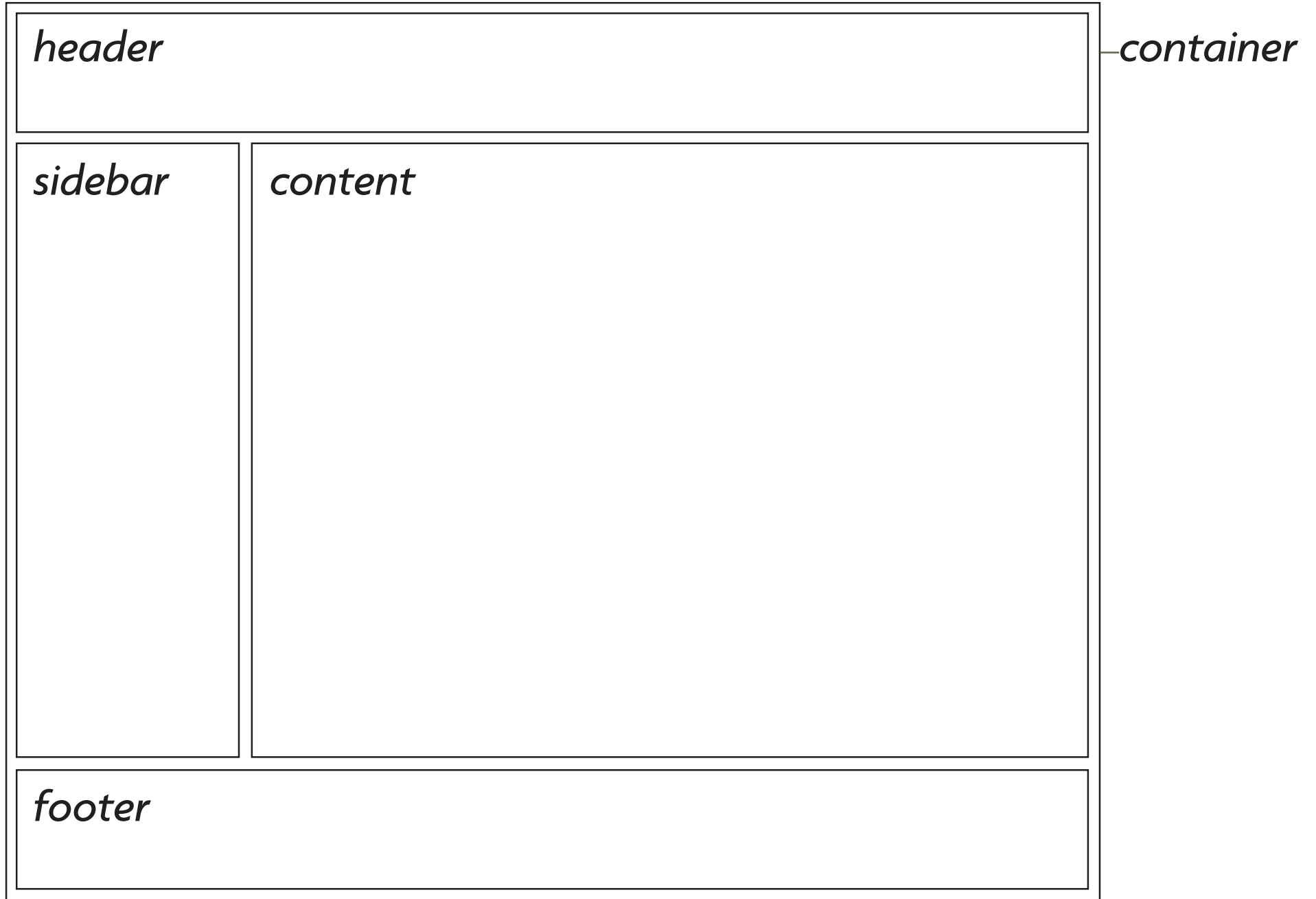
Classes are not unique. You can use the same class on multiple elements.

Simply put...

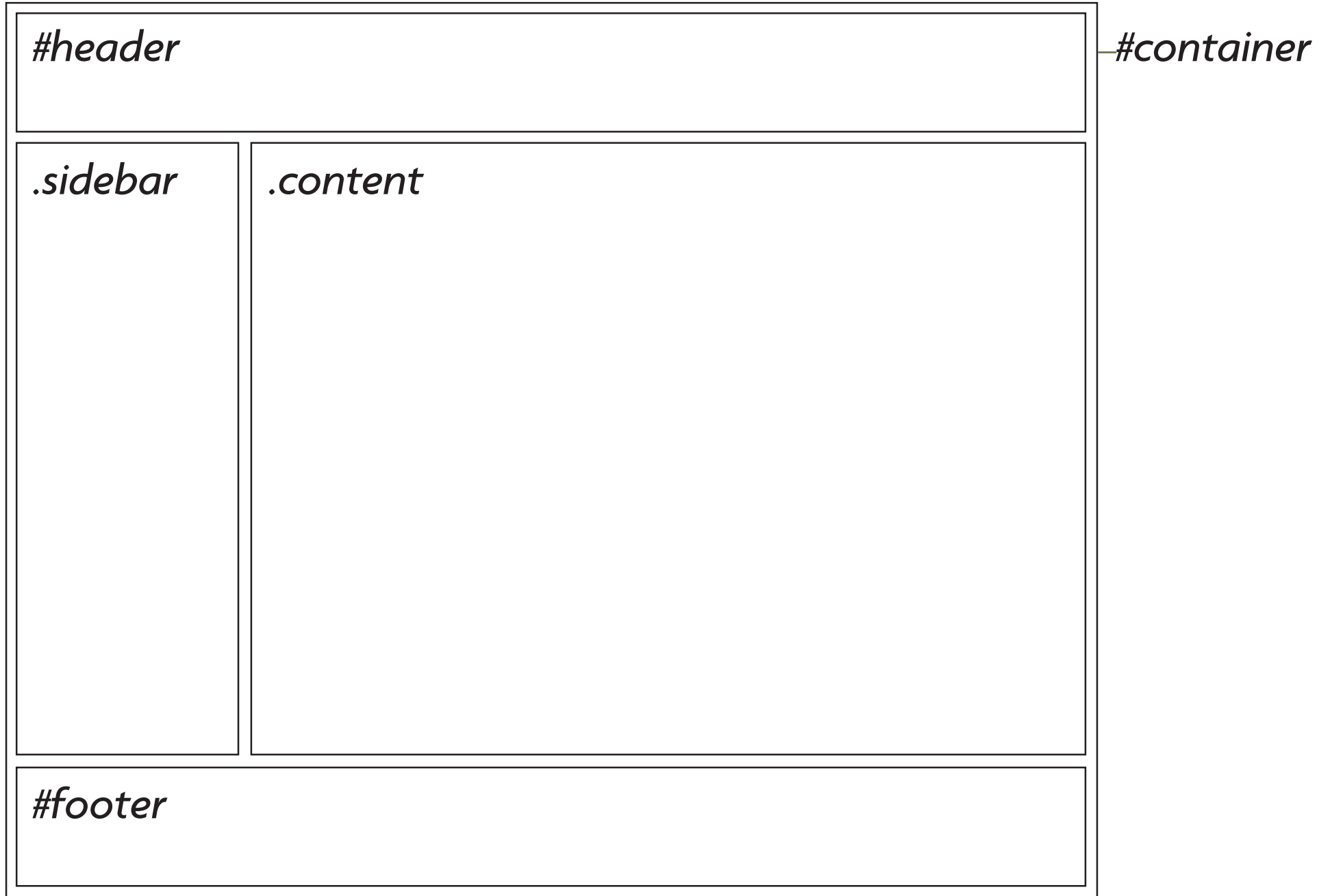
If I have an element that will only appear once on a page I use an ID.

Any element that can appear multiple times on a page uses a Class.

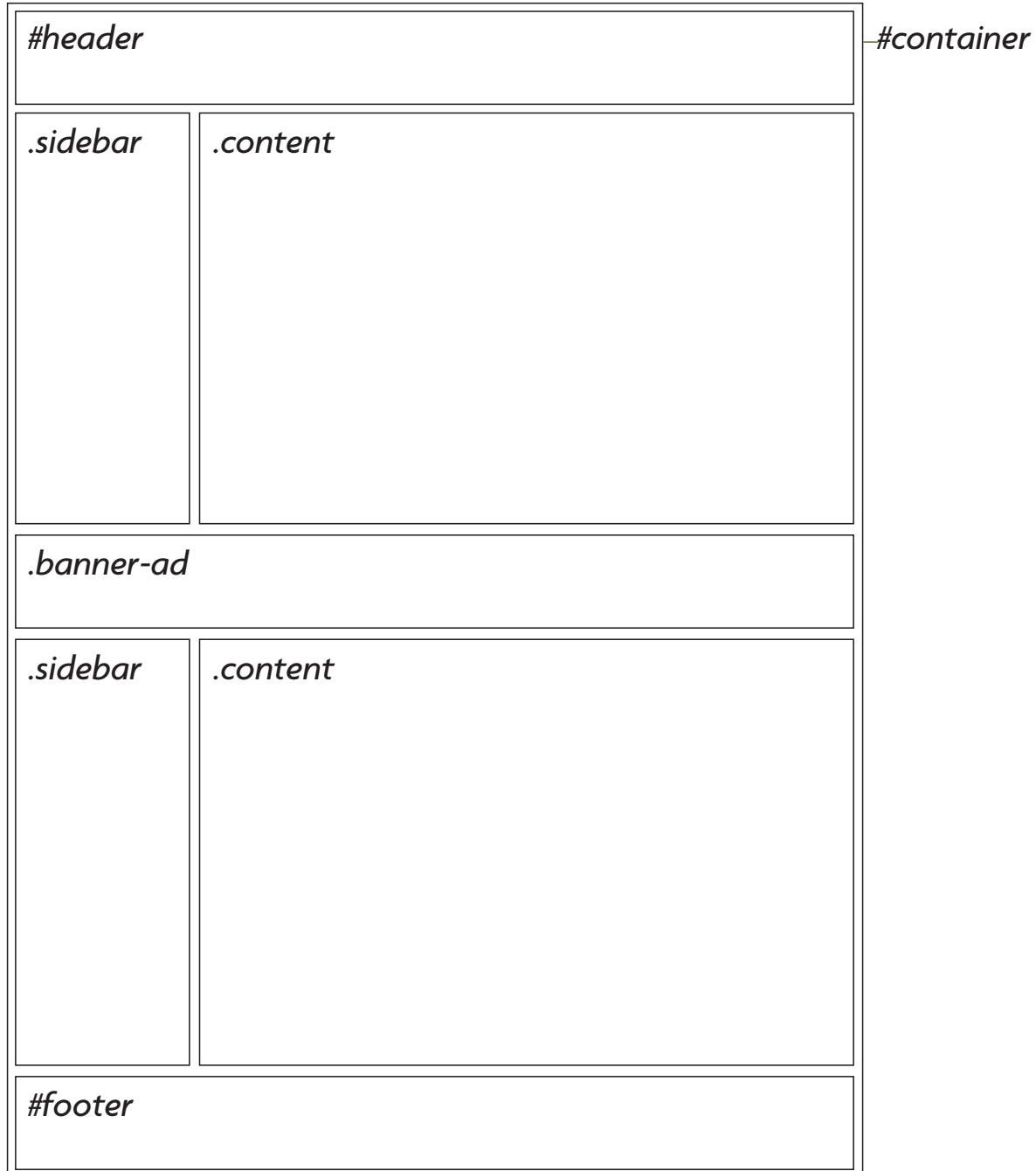
